

# No Cell, Bell To Bell **Updated Phone Policy**

The updated phone policy at Saegertown High School requires you to keep your phone away for the entire school day, excluding lunch. The policy was created to enable students to concentrate fully on instruction without digital distractions. Now, of course, some students aren't happy with the new rules because they like to look at their phones at the beginning or end of class, and now they can't do that. However, from firsthand experience, the new policy has started helping kids excel at school. Students have been paying more attention in class and have been less attached to their phones, engaging in more social

conversations instead of hiding behind a screen. Some students get anxiety or pressure from being on their phones too much, and this new policy has helped lessen that. Cyberbullying is also getting less and less common due to people being unable to converse with each other across classes. Students can have better relationships with their teachers without them getting velled at to put down their phones. It helps teacher-to-teacher connections by increasing face-to-face conversations. Some feel that the policy is a little harsh on the rules by banning all phone usage, but others feel that it is an understandable change.

The places phones are prohibited from are classrooms, restrooms, locker rooms, ISS/ Refocus rooms, during safety lockdowns, fire drills, in school offices, or in hallways between classes. The only acceptable place you can have your phone out is during breakfast and lunch in the cafeteria. Cell phones also must be turned off and stored in lockers before homeroom begins. If you are caught with your cell phone out, it will be held in the office until the end of the day. On the second strike, it is the exact same punishment plus 1 day of detention. Strike three results in a 3-day detention, and any other strikes result in disciplinary consequences. On strike four and every strike after that, your phone will be held in the office, there will be a parent meeting, students will get assigned ISS, and the parent will then have hold of the phone.

In conclusion, the school's

new policy is pretty harsh on the phone usage, but it is for the best of the students' well-being because they are off their phones while in an educational environ-

### **President Barack Obama's Visit To Erie**

The 44th President of the United States, Barack Obama, returned to Erie, PA, on September 16, 2025 for a speech to the citizens. Born and raised in Hawaii by his grandparents, Obama had quickly risen to the top with peace on his mind, working through college and moving to Chicago where he worked with a group of churches to help rebuild close communities devastated by the closure of local steel plants. With positive changes, he went to law school in 1988, where he graduated magna cum laude and won election as the first African-American president of the prestigious Harvard Law Review for the academic year of 1990-

On November 4th, 2008, Mr. Barack Obama was elected as the 44th President of the United States, where he won many more

votes than any other candidate in history. Now, as he lays off his presidential duties, he comes to preach on AI, Charlie Kirk, Palestine, Israel, and much more, hoping to spread the word to crowds all eager for his appearance once again.

"I like the history that he made for being the first African-American president," states Madelynn Ream, an 8th grader of SHS. "He made the world a better place through his elections, and chose peace."

As of his speech, his topics involved deeper with the case of Charlie Kirk's death, the evolution and opinions of the topic of AI, the Middle East, Pope Leo, his infamous tan suit, the topics of the 2012 Sandy Hook shooting and his feelings on violence, and even the events occurring with Palestine.

"It was two days after these beautiful six-year-old kids were shot and killed that I was with their families, and it was wrenching. It's the only time I saw a member of my detail cry while they were standing guard during my speech."

During Obama's speech, three agitators interrupted the man's conversation - and he had only responded to one. "There's no point in shouting at me about it. I'm not in charge of foreign policy, currently," states Obama to a heckler, who challenged him about U.S. policy on the humanitarian crisis in Palestine. "Those who carried out October 7th had something in their minds that said, 'these families, these women and children that we are going to slaughter in cold blood, are less than us. We are justified in perpetrating that kind of bru-




Homecoming is such a creative and fun way for students to express themselves, especially because there are themes
